

**LETTER OF INTENT BETWEEN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND THE
RESPECTIVE GOVERNMENTS OF THE FLEMISH, FRENCH AND GERMAN-
SPEAKING COMMUNITIES OF THE KINGDOM OF BELGIUM AND THE
GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED MEXICAN STATES ON THE NEGOTIATION
OF AN AGREEMENT IN THE AREA OF FILM COPRODUCTION**

The Federal Government and the respective governments of the Flemish, French and German-speaking Communities of the Kingdom of Belgium and the Government of the United Mexican States, through the Ministry of Culture, hereinafter referred to as “the Participants”;

ENCOURAGED by the desire to strengthen cooperation relations in the field of film between the Participants;

CONSCIOUS of the great importance of the preservation and promotion of cultural exchange in the field of cinema and in film industry, with the objective of guaranteeing the public access to a diverse supply of cinematographic works;

CONVINCED that these exchanges will contribute to the enhancement of artist and cultural mutual relations between the Participants;

NOTING the mutual desire to establish a framework for cooperation and to promote direct channels of communications between the competent authorities in the area of cinematographic cooperation;

Declare their intention:

1. To finalize negotiations of an agreement on cinematographic coproduction with the aim to improving coproduction and access to films in both countries.


2. To present the coproduction agreement before the competent authorities, at the earliest convenience.

Signed in Mexico City on this nineteenth day of February of two thousand and nineteen, in two originals, in the English and Spanish languages, both texts being equally valid.
